

THE QUESTION

The question is not whether neural tube defects matter. **They do.** The evidence that folic acid reduces them in low-risk women is questionable — with *nine babies dying, mostly miscarriages, for every claimed prevention.*

The NHS warns that many people must avoid exposure, including those with cancer, heart stents, B12 deficiency, or on renal dialysis.

WHERE WAS THE DEBATE?

This policy has **never been debated and voted on in the House of Commons as primary legislation.**

It is being introduced through a *Statutory Instrument* — secondary legislation that allows significant change with limited parliamentary scrutiny.

A decision affecting the entire population deserves a proper democratic debate.

CONSENT MATTERS

In medicine, patients are normally told what the intervention is, its expected benefits, its possible risks, and what alternatives exist.

Why should a policy affecting almost **every one of us** be any different?

Ask Parliament to hold a full debate before fortification begins.
